

A lifetime of impact, even beyond your own



How to leave a legacy

Leaving a legacy gift in your will is simple. All it takes is indicating the type of bequest you would like to make, along with the organization's name and address, in a new or existing will. This information should be shared with your attorney when drafting a new will or adapting an existing will.

You can choose to donate a lump sum or a percentage of your assets. Donating a percentage allows you to remain flexible as the value of your personal assets may rise and fall over a lifetime. If you know the exact amount you'd like to donate, you should indicate the fixed dollar amount in your will. Your estate doesn't have to have cash or securities to cover the gift amount, as long as the value of all of your assets is sufficient.

You can also choose if a "Second-to-Die Bequest" is right for you. This type of bequest ensures that if the will-holder's partner survives the will-holder, then the entire estate is left to the surviving partner. However, if the will-holder's partner does not survive the will-holder, then the entire estate is left according to the specifications of the will-holder.

Please ensure you include Medair's US office address and federal Employer Identification Number (EIN) in your bequest.

Giving Options

There are several options for leaving a legacy to Medair. Our donor relations officers are pleased to assist you in finding the right giving option for you.

Will or Trust

Simply mention Medair in your will or trust and the amount you'd like to donate. Your gift can be allocated in a variety of ways according to your preferences:

- **A Percentage Gift**
You can leave a percentage of your remaining assets to Medair. This is a flexible option as the value of your personal assets can rise and fall over a lifetime.
- **A Lump Sum Gift**
If you already know the amount you'd like to give, you can allocate a specific sum of money in your will to Medair.
- **A Second-to-Die Bequest**
This type of bequest ensures that if the will-holder's partner survives the will-holder, then the entire estate is left to the surviving partner. However, if the will-holder's partner does not survive the will-holder, then the entire estate is left according to the specifications of the will-holder.



Retirement Assets

The standard withdrawal formula for a retirement account is designed to make the balance last for your lifetime, and there is usually a remaining balance. That balance can make a great charitable gift, especially since leaving it to non-spouse family members generally makes it subject to income tax. A beneficiary designation is separate from the instructions in your will, so you can make this type of gift even if you don't have a will. Simply request a beneficiary designation form from your financial institution. You can leave the entire balance or a percentage of your remaining assets.

It's worth noting that you can also make donations during your lifetime (after the age of 70½) through qualified charitable distributions (QCDs) directly from your IRA.

Life Insurance Policy

As with retirement accounts, when you purchase a life insurance policy or are included in a group policy through your employer, you're given the opportunity to name beneficiaries. You can update the beneficiaries to include Medair at any time by requesting a new beneficiary designation form from your insurer. You can leave the entire policy amount or a percentage.

Other Non-Cash Assets

In addition to naming Medair a beneficiary of your life insurance policy or retirement account, you can choose to make a bequest through other non-cash assets such as stocks, bonds, and other securities. Check with a financial advisor to see if this is the right option for you.
